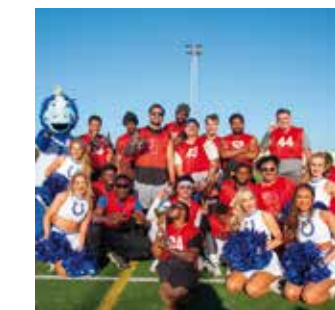

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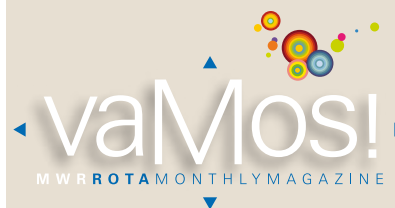

## TICKETS AND TRAVEL

### Vejer de la Frontera Historical Tour and Bolonia Roman Ruins

**Saturday, March 2, 8 a.m.-6 p.m.**  
\$55 per person / \$35 per child 2-14 years old / No cost for child under 2 years old.  
Must register by Feb. 28.

Vejer is a picturesque town perched high on a limestone headland. Although it was captured from the Moors by Fernando III el Santo, 700 years ago, it has not lost any of its Arab features. The town has several monuments worth seeing including, remains of a castle, the old wall and several gates. Climb the castle walls for a panoramic view of the open countryside. Local artisan shops in town offer a wide selection of hand-made goods at reasonable prices. After spending time in Vejer you will visit the Baelo Claudia Roman ruins in Bolonia. Baelo Claudia was undoubtedly the most important city in the framework of Andalusian Rome, under the jurisdiction of Claudius Caesar. It was erected at the end of the Second Century BC. The fall began to take place after the crisis in the Third Century AD and was worsened by the effects of a huge seaquake, the raids by Mauritanian hordes and dominant Germanic Pirates. Historical tour includes roundtrip transportation, a local guide in Vejer and entrance to the ruins.

### Malaga Historical Tour

**Saturday, March 9, 7 a.m.-9 p.m.**  
\$65 per person / \$55 per child 2-14 years old / No cost for child under 2 years old.  
Must register by March 6.

The city of Malaga, the capital city of the province of Malaga, is the second-largest city of Andalusia and lies along the Costa Del Sol. Famous for the "pasas" (raisins), Malaga is also well known for its superb wines. This historical tour will take you to the cathedral, Castle of Alcazaba, the harbor area, the local market and the location where Picasso was born. Trip includes roundtrip transportation, local guide, entrance to a monument and free time to shop and enjoy the local food and wine.

### Flamenco Show and Dinner

**Saturday, March 16, 6-10 p.m.**  
\$100 per person. Ages 18 years and older.  
Must register by March 13.

MWR will take you for a night of cultural experience watching flamenco. It involves singing, dance and guitar as well as rhythmic punctuation (by hand-claps and other methods). There are different types of pieces within flamenco, which are defined by characteristic melodic, rhythmic and harmonic structures. It is rooted in the gypsy (gitano) of Andalusia and probably influenced by North African rhythms. The "Gitanos" had settled in Andalusia early in the 15th century, and by the end of the 18th century several centers of "cante jondo" had emerged in Jerez and Sevilla. Trip includes roundtrip transportation, show and dinner

### Butterfly Museum and Puerto Marina in Benalmadena

**Saturday, March 23, 7 a.m.-9 p.m.**  
\$60 per person / \$50 per child 2-14 years old / No cost for child under 2 years old. Must register by March 20.

Tickets and Travel is taking a trip to the butterfly museum located in Benalmadena, Málaga. In this spectacular Thai temple, you can walk among more than 1,500 exotic butterflies from around the world, flying freely in a tropical paradise between waterfalls and flowers. You will be able to observe how they are born, how they reproduce and enjoy learning many things about these wonderful insects. Seventy percent of the specimens in the park are self-produced and the remaining thirty percent are imported from their country of origin. Almost every day, a new specimen is born, visitors can watch as the butterflies break out of their cocoons and spread their colorful wings

for the first time. Most species of butterflies have an average life expectancy of two weeks. This means that the park's population is renewed every 14 days. The trip includes roundtrip transportation, entrance to the butterfly museum, and some free time to visit the Buddhist temple and Puerto Marina in the town of Benalmadena.

### Semana Santa (Holy Week Procession) in Sevilla

**Friday, March 29, 3 p.m.-2 a.m.**  
\$35 per person / No cost for child under 14 years old. Must register by March 27.

Tickets and Travel will take you to one of the Andalusian cities with the highest Semana Santa tradition. In Sevilla, thousands of people walk about the city to view the religious processions that take place daily during Semana Santa. These processions occur at various locations throughout the city. Note: Be prepared to immerse yourself in a big crowd. Give yourself plenty of time to return to the bus pick up point in Sevilla. This trip includes roundtrip transportation only.

### Granada Self-Guided

**Saturday, March 30, 6 a.m-11 p.m.**  
\$40 per person / No cost for child under 14 years old. Must register by March 27.

Tickets and Travel takes you to explore the home to the fortress La Alhambra. Granada was the Moors final stand on the Iberian Peninsula. After over 700 years of reign, the Christian's final siege laid on this city and its palace perched high above. Today the city still retains much of its North African influence through stores, restaurants and teahouses. The long-time capital of Moorish Andalucía, offers some of the most important reminders of this time in Spanish history. The city offers charming narrow streets filled with flowers, taverns serving up the famous Trevélez jamon, flamenco in the gypsy caves of Sacromonte, shopping and more. This trip includes roundtrip transportation only.

### Running of the Bulls in Arcos

**Sunday, March 31, 9 a.m.-6 p.m.**  
\$35 per person / No cost for child under 14 years old. Must register by March 27.

Feel the adrenaline pulse through your body as fierce Spanish bulls run the winding streets of Arcos de la Frontera. Traveler will take you to the heart of the action as we join thousands of locals who celebrate this occasion each year. The streets are guaranteed to be filled with daring Spaniards ready to challenge the bull. The first bull will run at noon and the second at 3 p.m. **NAVSTA personnel are not authorized to run with the bull.** The trip includes roundtrip transportation only.







### Sanlucar de Barrameda Historical Tour

**Saturday, April 6, 9 a.m.-4 p.m.**  
\$60 per person / \$40 per child 2-14 years old / No cost for child under 2 years old.  
Must register by April 3.

The town stands on the left bank of the mouth of the River Guadalquivir, on land whose interior is rich in fruit trees and vineyards, where the famous Manzanilla wine is produced; near the coast and the river there are beaches and pine forests, such as La Algaída, and mud flats such as those at Bonanza, which is part of the Doñana Natural Park. There are a multitude of factors of interest to tourists, such as the climate, the beaches of Bajo de Guía, La Calzada, Las Piletas and La Jara, and a number of monuments: Saint James Castle, Our Lady's Church, the Duke of Medina Sidonia's Palace and Saint Domingo's Convent. In the 15th and 16th centuries it has acquired great importance as a point of contact with America, with many expeditions setting sail from its harbour, such a Columbus' 1498 expedition and the one undertaken by Magellan and Elcano in 1519. In 1583 it was declared a permanent starting point for such journeys. The trip includes roundtrip transportation, guided visit of the town and some free time for shopping and enjoy the town's local gastronomy and wine.

Outdoor Recreation trips are open to adults 18 years and older only.

### Canyon Descending

**Saturday, March 9, 6:45 a.m.-9 p.m.**  
\$85 per person. Must register by March 6.  
Canyoneering (also called canyon descending) consists of descending rivers by combining the techniques of climbing, caving and swimming. This activity is experiencing a spectacular popularity because of the beauty of its routes and the ideas of true adventure. Trip includes roundtrip transportation, insurance, wet suit, harness, helmet and professional guide. Note: you need to be able to swim.

### Via Ferrata in Grazalema Natural Park

**Saturday, March 16, 7:30 a.m.-6 p.m.**  
\$85 per person. Must register by March 13.  
A Via Ferrata (Italian for "iron way") is a mountain route equipped with steel cables, ladders, and other fixed anchors, for example wooden walkways and suspended bridges. The artificial equipment renders feasible an exposed route even to the inexperienced climber, and allows those not versed in climbing technique to hike on ledges, climb vertical walls, and reach the peaks of mountains. Running along ledges, up vertical rock walls and across exposed mountainsides, the artificial equipment makes the peaks accessible to everyone with a good level of fitness. Trip includes roundtrip transportation, expert guide and gear. **Difficulty level: moderate.**

### Hiking Garganta del Capitan in Los Alcornocales Natural Park

**Saturday, March 23, 7:30 a.m.-7 p.m.**  
\$60 per person. Must register by March 20.  
Outdoor Recreation is offering The Garganta del Capitán hike, in the municipality of Algeciras within the limits of the Los Alcornocales Natural Park and the Intercontinental Biosphere Reserve of the Mediterranean. Along the route we find laurel forests with alders, ash trees, laurels and gall oaks. On the way we can enjoy the views of the Bay of Algeciras, the cork oak forest, or the public mountain Hoyo de Don Pedro. We can also see tombs from the Bronze Age carved in the sandstone rock as well as the tombstone of the supposed "Captain" that gives its name to this gorge as well as old flour mills whose remains can still be seen on the banks of the stream. Along the trail there are frequent areas of shade. Maximum altitude is 140 m, unevenness of 125 m. Low/moderate level activity 7-kilometer hike. Trip includes roundtrip transportation and expert guides.

### Mountain Bike Ride at La Via Verde in Rota

**Saturday, March 30, 9 a.m.-2 p.m.**  
\$25 per person. Must register by March 27.  
The Rota's Greenway is on the old railway line linking El Puerto de Santa Maria and Sanlucar de Barrameda through the town of Rota. This ride is a low/moderate level challenge, in which you will be biking 30km. You can bring your own bike or get one (included in the price) at MWR Outdoor Recreation.

### Paintball

**Saturday, April 6, 8 a.m.-4 p.m.**  
\$75 per person. Must register by April 3.  
Paintball is one of Europe's fastest-growing sports and is becoming increasingly more popular in Spain. Paintball is played in over 40 countries, by millions of men and women, of all ages and lifestyles.
